





THE PARLIAMENTARY ASSEMBLY OF BOSNIA AND HERZEGOVINA 2002-2006

The Parliamentary Assembly of Bosnia and Herzegovina, the country's highest legislative authority, is composed of two Houses: the House of Representatives and the House of Peoples.

The Parliamentary Assembly promulgates legislation, approves budget and decides on sources and amounts of revenues financing the institutions of Bosnia and Herzegovina and the country's international obligations, approves the ratification of international treaties, and settles other issues, necessary for the exercise of parliamentary powers, as well as those transferred to it with the agreement of the Entities.

The Houses of the Parliamentary Assembly perform legislative, information-dissemination and oversight functions, and regulate their internal organization and the manner of their work.





Decision-making

All legislative decisions must be adopted by both Houses.

All decisions of the two Houses are made by majority of those present and voting. The majority comprises at least one third of the delegates or representatives elected in either Entity.

If the majority of votes does not comprise one third of votes from the territory of each Entity, the Speaker and the two Deputy Speakers meet as a committee within the next three days in order to reach agreement. If their efforts result in failure, the decision is then made by the majority of the total number of those present and voting - on condition that dissenting votes do not comprise two thirds or more of the delegates or representatives elected from either Entity.

A proposed decision of the Parliamentary Assembly can be declared destructive of a vital interest of Bosniak, Croat or Serb people, by the majority of votes of Bosniak, Croat or Serb delegates in the House of Peoples. Such proposed decision shall have to be approved by majority of the Bosniak, Croat and Serb delegates present and voting in the House of Peoples.

When the majority of Bosniak, Croat or Serb delegates raise an objection, in writing, to the declaration of the destructiveness of a vital interest, the Speaker of the House of Peoples convenes a joint three-member committee comprising one delegate from each of the three constituent peoples, in order to resolve that issue. If the committee fails to find a solution within the next five days, the matter is then referred by the Speaker to the Constitutional Court of BiH, which in an expedited procedure reviews it for procedural regularity.

Basic legislative procedure

A bill may be introduced by any delegate or representative, a Committee of the House, the House, as well as by the BiH Presidency and the Council of Ministers.

The Constitutional and Legal Affairs Committee gives its opinion on the bill's compliance with the Constitution.

The competent committee considers the bill and amendments thereto, and can hold a public hearing on the bill, involving interested bodies, expert institutions and individuals. After the deadline fixed expires, the competent committee presents its report to the House, setting out a general statement on the principles of the bill, as well as on the neces-

sity to pass it, including all amendments approved in the committee. The committee's rapporteur defends the Committee's position at the plenary session.

Representatives and caucuses may propose amendments disputing the amendments approved by the committee, and can once more table the amendments rejected by the committee, at least 48 hours before the plenary session begins.

The debate in the House begins with a first reading related to the necessity of the bill's adoption and to the principles on which the proposed law is based, as stated in the Committee's report.

The second reading consists of the debate and vote on the proposed amendments, followed by the vote on the bill in its final text.



Particularities of the Houses

A decision submitted for consideration in the House of Peoples can be declared destructive of a vital interest of either Bosniak, Croat or Serb people. The House of Peoples can be dissolved by the Presidency of BiH or by the House of Peoples itself.

The House of Representatives approves the nomination of the Chair of the Council of Ministers of BiH and also approves the appointments of the other members of the Council of Ministers of BiH. The House of Representatives appoints a replacing member of the Presidency of BiH, if one of the Presidency members ceases performing his duties for any reason, or if he becomes permanently or temporarily incapacitated to carry out his duties.



HOUSE OF PEOPLES OF THE PARLIAMENTARY ASSEMBLY OF BIH

The House of Peoples is comprised of 15 delegates, where the designated Croat and Bosniak delegates from the Federation are selected, respectively, by the Croat and Bosniak delegates to the House of Peoples of the Federation, and the delegates from the Republika Srpska are selected by the National Assembly of the Republika Srpska of BiH.

Collegium of the House of Peoples

The House of Peoples elects from among its delegates one Bosniak, one Croat and one Serb to the posts of the Speaker, the First Deputy Speaker and the Second Deputy Speaker, and the Speaker's post is held on an automatically rotating eight-month basis.

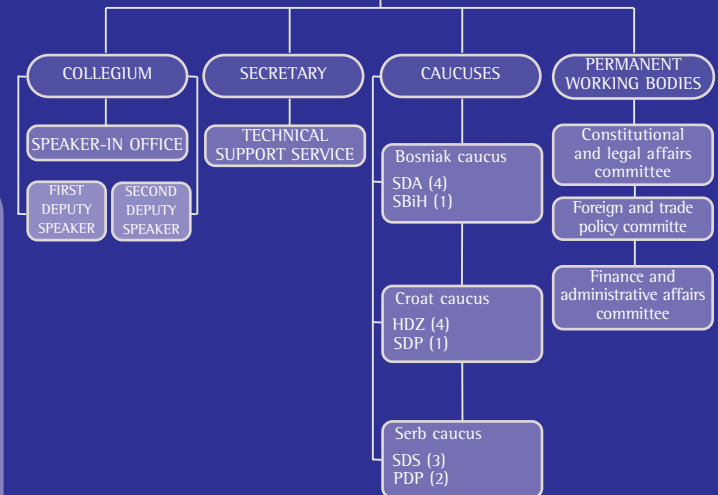
The Collegium is composed of the Speaker, First Deputy Speaker and Second Deputy Speaker of the House of Peoples.

The Collegium of the House of Peoples is responsible for the implementation of the rights and duties of the delegates; for the exercise of the House's rights and duties towards the Presidency of Bosnia and Herzegovina and the Council of Ministers of Bosnia and Herzegovina; for cooperation with the House of Representatives, for consultations regarding the business and agenda of the House of Peoples' sittings, as well as for other matters that might affect the smooth functioning of the House of Peoples.

The Collegium of the House appoints the Secretary of the House.

The House of Peoples has three standing committees:

Constitutional and legal affairs committee,
Foreign affairs and trade policy committee,
Financial and budgetary issues committee.

No Committee may have more than six members, with two members representing each of the three caucuses.

The House can also set up temporary committees to report to the House on draft laws and other regulations, or to investigate specific matters.

The committees elect from among their members a chair, a first deputy chair and a second deputy chair. They are elected from the three constituent peoples.

The Committees give their opinion, submit proposals and reports to the House of Peoples, and carry out other duties as provided by the Rules of Procedure and the law. The Committees also decide on issues referred to them by the House, that do not entail the responsibility for the adoption of laws.

The committee decides by simple majority, providing that a quorum is secured in which representatives of all three constituent peoples are present. In making final decisions upon which the House does not pronounce, the committee decides by majority of votes representing all three constituent peoples, and concerted efforts to reach an agreement are undertaken among the Chair, First and Second Deputy Chair of the Committee. If the agreement is reached, the agreed decision is once more put to the vote at the session of the Committee. In cases not explicitly regulated by the House of Peoples' Rules of Procedures, the proceedings in the committees follow the basic provisions governing the legislative activities.

For the purpose of examining certain issues falling within its remit, compiling a report or preparing a law, the Committee may establish a sub-committee or working group and define its terms of reference, and may request temporary services of professional experts.

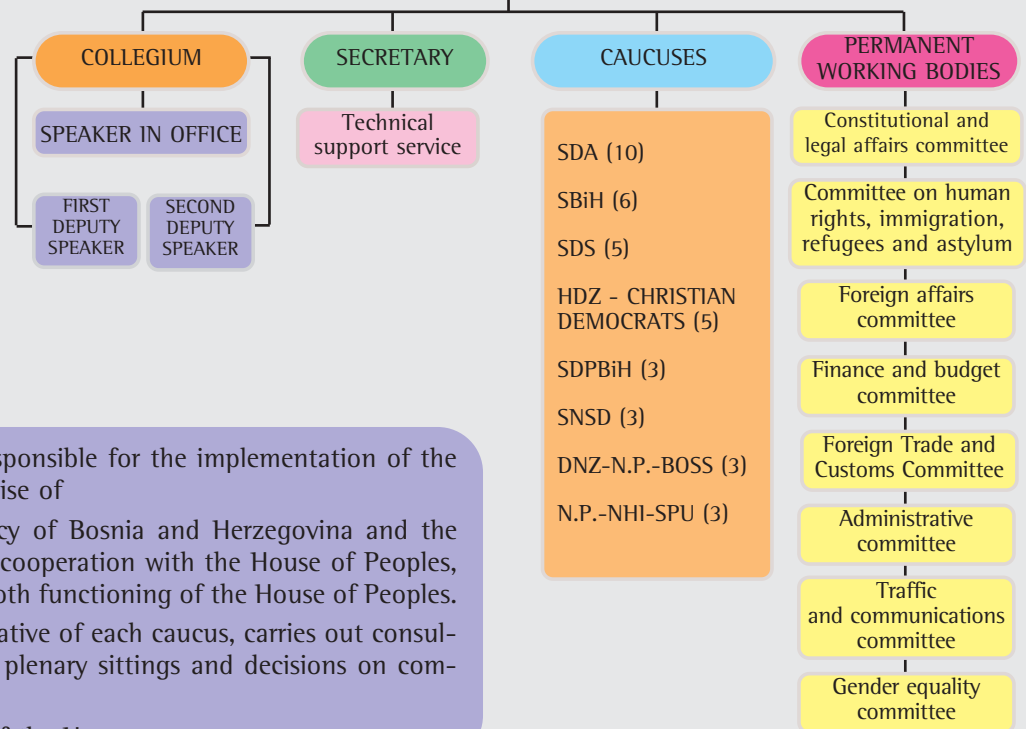


HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES

The House of Representatives is composed of 42 directly elected members, two-thirds of whom from the Federation of BiH and one-third from the Republika Srpska of BiH.

From among its representatives the House of Representatives elects one Bosniak, one Croat and one Serb to the posts of the Speaker, the First Deputy Speaker and the Second Deputy Speaker, and with the Speaker's post held on an automatically rotating eight-month basis. The Collegium of the House is composed of the Speaker, First Deputy Speaker and Second Deputy Speaker of the House of Representatives.

The Collegium of the House of Representatives is responsible for the implementation of the rights and duties of the representatives; for the exercise of

the House's rights and duties towards the Presidency of Bosnia and Herzegovina and the Council of Ministers of Bosnia and Herzegovina; for cooperation with the House of Peoples, as well as for other matters that might affect the smooth functioning of the House of Peoples.

The extended House Collegium, involving a representative of each caucus, carries out consultations related to the preparations of the agenda of plenary sittings and decisions on compulsory and other items, as appropriate.

The Collegium of the House appoints the Secretary of the House.

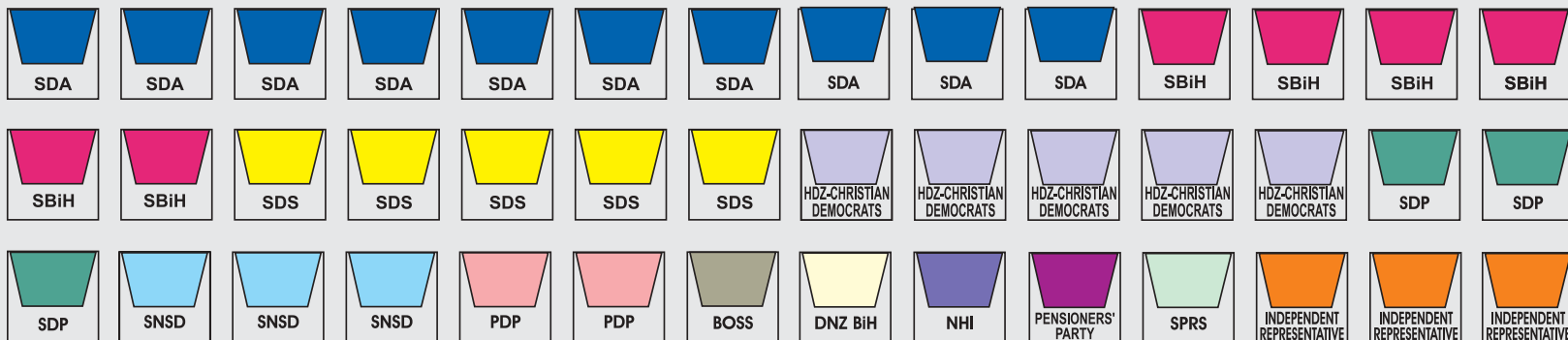

Committees of the House of Representatives

No Committee may have more than nine members. The allocation of the seats is proportional to the size of the caucuses in the House, having always two thirds from the Federation of BiH and one third from the RS of BiH.

The committees elect from among their members a chair, a first deputy chair and a second deputy chair. They are elected from the three constituent peoples.

In accordance with the House's Rules of Procedure's and the law, Committees give their opinion, submit proposals and reports to the House and carry out other duties as provided by the Rules of Procedure. Furthermore, Committees decide on issues referred to them by the House, that do not entail the responsibility for the adoption of laws.

The committee decides by simple majority, providing that at least a majority of its members are present, save for final decisions upon which the House does not pronounce, when the committee decides in accordance with the House decision-making procedure. If a disagreement arises, the chair and the two deputy chairs undertake concerted efforts to reach an agreement.

The House can also decide to set up temporary or investigating committees.

JOINT COMMITTEES OF BOTH HOUSES OF THE PA BiH

The two Houses may decide to jointly set up standing or temporary committees, comprising both delegates and representatives, tasked with following, monitoring and examining specific issues, as well as with preparing and submitting proposals for the adoption of laws and other regulations within the competence shared by both Houses. The scope of activities, tasks and remit of a joint committee of both Houses are defined by identical conclusions of the two Houses.

Equal number of members from both Houses is appointed to the joint committee. The chair and the two vice-chairs of the joint committee of the two Houses cannot belong to the same House or the same constituent peoples. The selection of the committee members is considered completed as soon as the two Houses make the decision in the identical text on the selection of their respective members.

The work of the joint committee is governed by provisions of the Rules of Procedure of the two Houses, unless otherwise defined by the conclusion made by the joint committee concerning the establishment of the committee.
